ORDINANCE 2023 - 73

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE DECEMBER 2022 REPLACEMENT PAGES OF THE NEW CONCORD CODIFIED ORDINANCES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, certain provisions within the Village of New Concord Codified Ordinances should be amended to conform with current State law as required by the Ohio Constitution, and

WHEREAS, various ordinances of a general and permanent nature have been passed by New Concord Village Council which should be included in the Codified Ordinances, and

WHEREAS, other ordinances are not of a general and permanent nature, including but not limited to matters of contracts, appropriations, funding and salaries, and

WHEREAS, the Village has heretofore entered into a contract with the Walter H. Drane Company to prepare and publish such revisions, which are presently before Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the Village of New Concord, State of Ohio, that:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, welfare and safety and for the further reason that there exists an imperative necessity for the earliest publication and distribution of the December 2022 Codified Ordinances to the officials and residents of the Municipality, so as to facilitate administration, daily operation and avoid practical and legal entanglements. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
