RESOLUTION 2024 – 7 – 2

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MUSKINGUM COUNTY ENGINEER TO PREPARE AND SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT AND/OR LOCAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM(S) AND AUTHORIZING MUSKINGUM COUNTY TO EXECUTE CONTRACTS AS REQUIRED AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the State Capital Improvement Program and the Local Transportation Improvement Program both provide financial assistance to political subdivisions for capital improvements to public infrastructure, and

WHEREAS, the Village of New Concord desires to make capital improvements to resurface John Glenn School Road from the west corporation limit to the east corporation limit.

WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvements herein above described are considered to be a priority need for the community and are a qualified project under OPWC programs.

WHEREAS, the immediate adoption of this resolution is necessary to the health, safety, and welfare of Village residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the Village of New Concord, Ohio that:

Section 1. The Council of the Village of New Concord hereby authorizes the Muskingum County Engineer to act as project manager and prepare said applications, the president of the Board of Muskingum County Commissioners to act as Chief Executive Officer, and the Muskingum County Auditor to act as Chief Fiscal Officer for the proposed project.

Section 2. The Village of New Concord hereby agrees to allow the Board of Muskingum County Commissioners to advertise for bid and enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder for the resurfacing of John Glenn School Road.

Section 3. The Village of New Concord hereby agrees to pay project costs over and above the OPWC grant amount. The minimum amount of local matching funds will be 33% of the total village project cost. The total project cost of the village portion is estimated at \$49,617. The estimated local matching funds will be \$16,373.61 based on the 33% local share amount. The final local share will be determined by the amount bid and quantities placed by the successful bidder following the completion of the work. If the project cost exceeds the estimated amount or a change order is required, the village will preapprove any additional costs prior to the work being performed.


