Your elected officials want New Concord voters to have all the information needed to make an informed vote on local topics in this election.

Below are some questions and answers that we hope are helpful.

STREET LEVY FAQs

What is this levy for?

It provides vital funding for street, road and bridge maintenance, repair, paving, construction and reconstruction throughout the Village of New Concord.

Is this a new tax?

No. This is **not** a new tax.

How long have we had this levy?

New Concord residents have passed this levy every 5 years since it began in 1985. Forty (40) years with no increase in millage – 3.2 mills

What kind of levy is this?

This is called a replacement tax levy, which extends the expiring levy for an additional period of time, in our case, for 5 years. If passed, this replacement levy will begin in 2025 and will be first due in 2026.

How much will I pay?

The millage is based on the taxable (assessed) value of your property. The assessed value is 35% of your appraised value.

Can you give me an example?

\$100,000 (appraised value) X 35% = \$35,000 (Assessed Value) \$35,000 (assessed value) x 1 mill (.0010) = \$35 in tax per mill \$35 in tax per mill x 3.2 mills = \$112 annual payment

What will it look like on the ballot?

Proposed Tax Levy (Replacement)

Village of New Concord
A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.

A replacement of a tax for the benefit of the Village of New Concord for the purpose of the general construction, reconstruction, resurfacing, and repair of streets, roads and bridges that the county auditor estimates will collect \$134,000 annually, at a rate not exceeding 3.2 mills for each \$1 of taxable value, which amounts to \$112 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value, for 5 years, commencing in 2025, first due in calendar year 2026.
